

His hometown of Ahmedabad is prominently featured in Patel's compositions; his series of Cityscape. Street scenes from the walled city form a large source of inspiration for the artist and several of Patel's works have been created en plein air in the streets of the heritage city.

The subject matter is not as important to him as the application and material he uses in his artwork. The materials he uses in his paintings are varied and mostly derived from experimenting with different textures, paints, metals etc. He has worked with a wide range of mediums using chrome plating, paint collage, mix media with enamel paint, transferred ink and real materials. He enjoys working on surfaces using different layers of paint such as enamel, acrylic and paper collage.

Pulkit has never followed a set sequence to create his work, just one little concept sparks and that takes him straight to the final creation. His work starts off very abstractly. His artworks depend on the surfaces which are made unconsciously. Whatever his surface reflects, accordingly he juxtaposes his compositions through real life experiences. The materials he uses in his work are varied and mostly derived from experimenting with different textures, paints, metals etc.

He has participated in multiple group show & fairs across the country, Pulkit lives and works from Ahmedabad.



SHAIK AZGHARALI

Shaik in his current practice as a sculptor tries to achieve the forms that are minimal in structure, yet have a pertinent geometrical language. These forms are motivated from day to day life as my observation towards society and how I look at the environment and its existence.

The clean and bright surface of the sculptures are deceptive, it resembles the stories, feelings and emotions towards human differences and relations. There are the forms of flowers, seeds and many tentative living things that live in our surroundings.

Bright paints create a layer of familiarity and affection towards otherwise sharp and heavy material and practice which they conceal, inviting the viewer to come closer to the spatial intervention. His sculptures have highly opinionated surfaces that project in multiple directions.



SHAJI APPUKUTTAN

Shaji Appukuttan's art practice explores geopolitics not as an extravaganza but an existential one, as essential as planetary survival. Ecological footprints have been visible in every nook and corner of the planet. The effects of ecological overshoot are discernible in the crises of global warming and climate change. The tyranny of the anthropocene and the proliferation of the techno sphere have caused a seismic shift in nature's ontology and fundamentally disrupted the living planet's biosphere, lithosphere, and atmosphere. These planetary concerns have been there and continue to haunt him, both in the foreground and background of his paintings. For Shaji, the social life of hills, rivers, and forests are synonymous with the logos of human associations. symbolically, the ensemble of that relationality would find an echo in his works.

Shaji studied at the Government Fine Arts College, Thrissur, Kerala. He has been a recipient of Kerala Lalitha Kala Akademi State Award in 1992, Sidhartha Foundation award in 2018. He also received a grant from Jackson Pollock Krasner Foundation, New York in 2020-21. Recently, he had a solo exhibition "Ghost Trees" at Lalithkala Akademi Art Gallery, Payyannur – Kannur (2023).
